Waltham Historical Society Celebrates Historic Waltham Days with Multiple Events in July

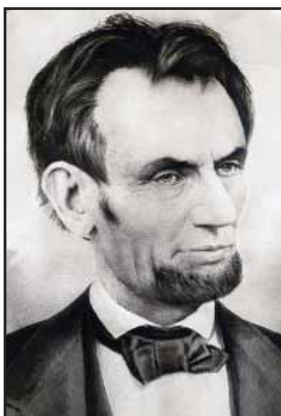
This year the Waltham Historical Society is celebrating by offering a number of exciting events!
